Groot Trash Removal and Notes:

- FREE Fall Leaf and Brush Collection:
 - October 5 through December 15, leaf and brush collection will be provided by Groot at no charge.
 - Leaves and brush must be placed in standard paper yard waste bags or cans that are clearly marked with a red "X" and placed at the curb on our regular Thursday collection days. (Bagged lawn clippings and other, general yard waste need to be bagged separately and require a sticker.)
- Trash containers and regular weekly trash removal:
 - Per Village Code, place trash cans at the curb *after* 5pm the night before trash is picked up and return empty trash containers to your storage area by 11pm after pick up.
 - The Village may impose fines for trash cans which are left out!

• 2023 Holiday Trash pickup:

- Thanksgiving: Collection delayed by 1 day after Thanksgiving (Ours will be the Friday following Thanksgiving)
- Christmas: Collection delayed by 1 day after Christmas (Ours will be the Friday following Christmas)

The "Inside Curve", parked cars and the "Need for Speed"

- There are 4 right angle turns without stop signs on the streets of Glenmoor. Residents have suggested that in order to avoid blocking visibility and to increase public safety, we **avoid parking** on the inside, or short side, of those curves. The most concerning spot is the first turn on Redwood just after the intersection of Ivy and Redwood.
- It's less than ½ mile from the entrance of Glenmoor to the home at the farthest point in the subdivision.
 - At our posted speed limit of 25mph, it only takes 58 sec. to drive that ½ mile.
 - For those who would make that drive at 35mph, *only 16 seconds are saved*. For those who drive at 30mph, *only 10 seconds are saved*!
 - Have you got 16 sec. or less to protect the safety of our residents? Please be mindful of your speed and slow down! You may save the life of a child or a beloved family pet.
