- Beautiful, but the whole plant or parts of these plants are *poisonous* to pets and/or humans!
 - Mistletoe, poinsettia, lilies of any kind, holly, amaryllis, juniper, and daffodils.
- Nice



 The clear winner for a safe and festive indoor holiday plant is the CHRISTMAS CACTUS! Inexpensive and commonly available at home stores, nurseries, and grocery stores, the ever-hardy and beautiful Christmas Cactus is easily grown, blooms in early Dec. each year, and provides indoor greenery year-round. Blooms may be red, white, yellow, or shades of pink.


>>> A FEW WORDS ABOUT YOUR (LIVE) CHRISTMAS TREE

- Live Christmas trees evoke warm childhood memories and smell fabulous, but if not carefully managed, may present a significant and aggressive fire hazard.
 - When buying trees, either cut your own at a local tree farm or check your pre-cut tree carefully for hydration.
 - Watch for shedding of needles, bare spots, and discolored, brittle, or dry needles.
 - Place your tree away from heat sources or fireplaces.
 - Check and top off water in your tree stand daily.
 - Avoid leaving lights on when the tree is not monitored.
 - Small lights, or "fairy lights" are especially hot.
 - Tinsel, which is made of PVC, is both highly flammable and an extreme health hazard if ingested by pets and small children.
- Groot will provide free collection of live Christmas trees throughout the month of January. No sticker required. Trees must be free of all decoration. Do not place trees in plastic bags. Trees over 6 ft. tall must be cut in half. Trees must be easily accessible to Groot workers and must not be buried in the snow.
