 Oct. 31 Apr.15 2AM 5AM The Village is actively issuing fines!

 (Failure to do so may result in a fine from the Village!)
- To avoid a fine by the Village, ALL outdoor Christmas decorations and lighting must be removed by 60 days after Christmas. (February 25, 2024)
- PLEASE! Don't forget to return your empty trash and recycling containers to their discrete location by 11PM on garbage pick up day!
- DANGEROUS CURVE, SPEED, and PARKED CARS! Parking cars on the inside of the tight curve on Redwood near Ivy limits visiblilty in both directions and creates a hazzard, especially in winter conditions. Please avoid doing so if possibl!



Judi's Tips to Extending the Life of Seeds

Cleaning up from summer. I'm planning for *SPRING*! January/February/March is my time for Cleaning and Organizing. In cleaning my kitchen desk I found seed packets that I forgot to store. Yes, there are tips to taking care of seeds:

- **Reducing humidity** is the most-important factor in extending the life of seeds. Relative humidity below 60% is best.
- **Do NOT store seeds in your garage** where they may be exposed to high humidity in the summer.
- Store your seeds in a cool, dry location away from direct sunlight. Temperatures above 90 degrees Fahrenheit will greatly decrease the viability of your seed for future planting seasons.
- Store seeds in sealed containers, plastic bags, and wax or paper envelopes. Be sure that moisture is not trapped within the sealed containers.
- A refrigerator is a good option for seed storage that can extend
 the storage life by several years. Store seeds in a sealed
 container. When you remove from cold storage, let the container
 reach room temperature before opening the container to avoid
 condensation on the seeds within the container. Anywhere in
 the basement is another good option.

ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT!

- THERE ARE 10 FIRE HYDRANTS IN GLENMOOR!
- WINTER STORMS OFTEN BURY FIRE HYDRANTS,
 MAKING IT DIFFICULT FOR FIREFIGHTERS TO LOCATE AND UTILIZE THEM QUICKLY
 IN AN EMERGENCY.
- BY "ADOPTING" A FIRE HYDRANT CLOSE TO YOUR HOME AND KEEPING IT CLEAR OF SNOW, YOU CAN HELP TO KEEP THE COMMUNITY SAFER.
- WHEN MAINTAINING ACCESS TO A HYDRANT, A THREE-FOOT, AREA SHOULD BE CLEARED AROUND THE ENTIRE HYDRANT AND A PATH SHOVELED FROM THE ROADWAY TO THE FIRE HYDRANT.
