GROOT FREE COLLECTION of LEAVES and BRUSH CONTIUNUESthrough December 15!


- Leaves must be placed at the curb on Garbage Day in standard paper yard waste bags or cans that are clearly marked with a RED "X".
 - Brush must be tied in 4 ft. or shorter bundles.
 - Bagged lawn clippings along with other general yard waste are not included as free collection, must be placed separately from bagged leaves and bundled branches and will require the use of prepaid stickers.
- PLEASE! Do not blow leaves on to streets!

Planning Ahead - FREE Groot Christmas Tree Disposal!

- Groot Industries will provide free collection of Christmas trees throughout the month of January. No sticker will be required.
 - Trees must be free of all lights, ornaments and tinsel in order to be recycled. Trees not free of foreign materials must be disposed of as refuse.

Village of Algonquin Winter Parking Regulations in effect NOW through April 15.

No Street Parking 2am - 5am or after snowfall of 2" or more. Schedule <u>Limited overnight parking online</u> or by contacting the Algonquin Police Department at (847) 658-4531.

Each residence or vehicle is limited to five parking requests per month.



Per Village Code: Algonquin Residents are
Personally Responsible
for SNOW REMOVAL from SIDEWALKS
adjacent to their property.

"Property owners MUST remove snow and ice from sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall. If snow or ice can't be removed, the area should be sanded or treated to reduce the risk for pedestrians."

Be Aware! The Village may impose fines for lack of compliance.
