

Groot Trash pick up -THURSDAYS throughout April.

Per VILLAGE ORDINANCE, do not leave empty trash cans in front of homes, garages, or in locations visible from the street following pickup.





A LITTLE HELP FROM GROOT AND THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN TO SPRUCE UP YOUR HOME AND YARD FOR SPRING!

- Get Ready for Groot FREE Spring Cleanup!
 - April 26 (Saturday)
 - This program encourages residents to reduce fire hazards in their homes and to "spruce up" their neighborhoods.
 - STICKERS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS SPECIAL PICKUP.
 - Typical discarded items include toys, old clothes, couches, beds, dressers, grills, and patio furniture.
 - Items that will not be collected include (but are not limited to): automobile parts, landscape waste, white goods, electronics, and construction materials such as broken concrete and large amounts of lumber and brick.
 - Please have all your discarded items at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on April 26!
- Groot FREE Spring Leaf and Brush Collection
 - With regular Thursday Pickup Apr. 10 Apr 25
 - Groot will provide free pickup of leaves and branches.
 - Branches must be tied in bundles that are not more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter
 - Leaves must be placed in standard paper yard waste bags or reusable containers that are clearly marked with a red "X."
 - Place the bags or cans at the curb, which will be collected on your regular pickup day.
 - Leaves placed in loose piles will NOT be picked up.
 - Grass clippings and other yard waste will still require a collection sticker.
 - Any bags or cans that contain leaves mixed with other yard waste will also require a collection sticker.
 - The stickers for garbage and yard waste are interchangeable.


FACT: PRUNING ENCOURAGES GROWTH & PROMOTES PLANT HEALTH






One of my favorite sayings is that, "You can't bring the dead back to life". Prune the dead. It will help the plant survive. Prune now and do less the rest of the summer. Save money, prune instead of replacing. Spireas (many of you have them in your yards) benefit from a cut almost all the way to the ground at this time. If you have never done it, I encourage you to try it. They'll come back beautifully **THIS** year. Some flowering Shrubs have to be pruned **AFTER** they bloom. It's important to look up the specific plant that you want to prune.

Judi's TECH TIP: Use Google Lens (Google search) to identify the plant or ask me. It's FREE and pretty accurate. It's already on your phone if you use Google. Side note: I use it at Estate Sales to look up what a kitchen gadget might be and the listed price. Lots of ways to use it.





Here's why pruning works:

- **Stimulates Growth**: Spring is when plants wake from dormancy. Pruning redirects energy to new shoots and buds.
- Removes Damage: Cuts away dead or weak growth from winter, reducing pest and disease risks.
- Improves Structure: Trim crowded branches for better airflow and sunlight, key for photosynthesis and disease prevention.
- Boosts Blooms: Encourages flowering in plants like roses or fruit trees by fostering new wood.
- Ideal Timing: Early spring, pre-bud break, suits most plants. It's less stressful than fall or summer cuts.

Spring pruning gives plants a clean slate for vigorous growth, better yields, and a neat appearance.
